

AGFOSY is an EU funded Erasmus+ project that will create a flexible training system relating to agroforestry. It will be based on case studies and best practices that will provide farmers and landowners with the skills, knowledge and competencies to implement agroforestry systems on their own farms.

Agroforestry (AF) is a land-use system where trees are grown in association with agricultural crops or livestock on the same land. Such measures can bring a wide range of positive benefits to land management, as well as to help landowners to achieve the goals of the Common Agricultural Policy.

The project began in 2018 and will run for 24 months. The consortium is made up on 7 partners from 6 countries.

The project will:

- Create a state-of-the-art analysis on the situation of agroforestry implementation in partner countries
- Compile a set of interesting case studies that will represent the core content of the training system
- Develop methodological sheets for establishment and management of agroforestry
- · Develop training materials with introductory videos.

The 4th international project should have taken place in Sopron at the beginning of May 2020. Due to the complex epidemiological situation in Europe, the meeting took place online but the agenda was full of great topics.

The meeting began with discussion of project administration, with explanations of the situations in each of the partner countries and how the project would continue in light of the continued travel bans. As anticipated, all countries have at least some travel restrictions, thus making future conference planning quite difficult.

Next was a discussion of the remaining Intellectual outputs; an in-depth final discussion about Intellectual Outputs 3 & amp; 4 will follow later in this newsletter. At present, all intellectual outputs continue to proceed successfully, though unfortunately Covid19 has created a few delays in some processes. Intellectual outputs 1 through 4 have been published with only the videos from Intellectual Output 5 to be posted.


The meeting concluded with a discussion of project reporting and reviewing the final steps of the project, as it will be coming to an end November 30, 2020.

For example, did you know that riparian buffers prevent water from heating too much, banks from eroding too fast and support freshwater life? Or that tree fodder can provide a source of feed in the winter when dried and stored?

These are just a few of the great facts you can learn from our website. In regards to Intellectual Output 4, you can also find it on our website. These Study materials contain 10 modules (presentations) with information about major agroforestry systems in Europe, ecological aspects of agroforestry, the historical context to agroforestry systems, management and practice of tree planting, silvopastoral agroforestry systems, silvoarable agroforestry systems, economy and the legal aspects in European agroforestry etc.
